# The Ridges Bikini Top

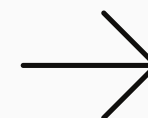
Details

This pattern is written in one size (Medium) and may be adapted to multiple sizes (quantity of yarn will differ)

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## Materials

- 75 yards worsted weight yarn  
(1 cake Darn Good Yarn  
Recycled Silk Roving in Ocean  
Light)
- Crochet hook size 5.0mm
- Tapestry Needle
- 6mm width elastic cord, cut to  
approx. 12 inches length  
(optional)

## Terms

CH - Chain

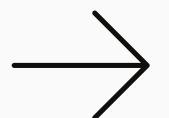
SC - Single Crochet

DC - Double Crochet

BPDC - Back Post Double Crochet

SL-ST - Slip Stitch

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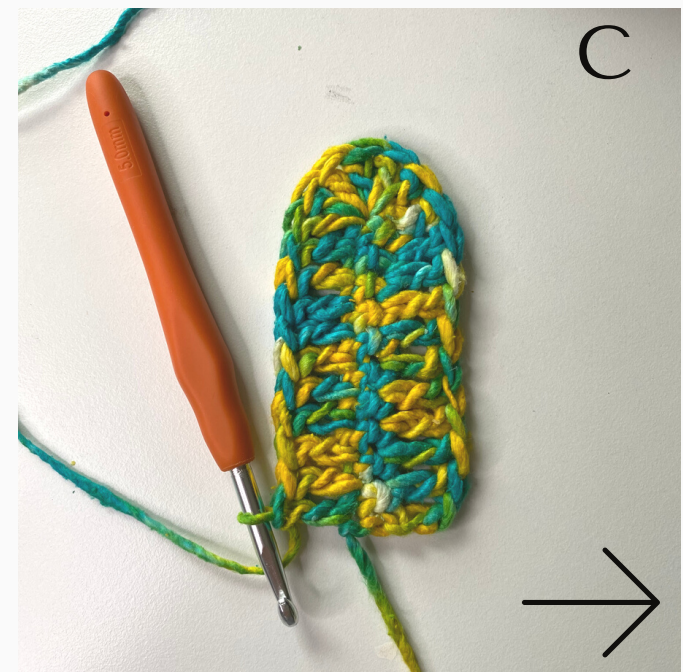
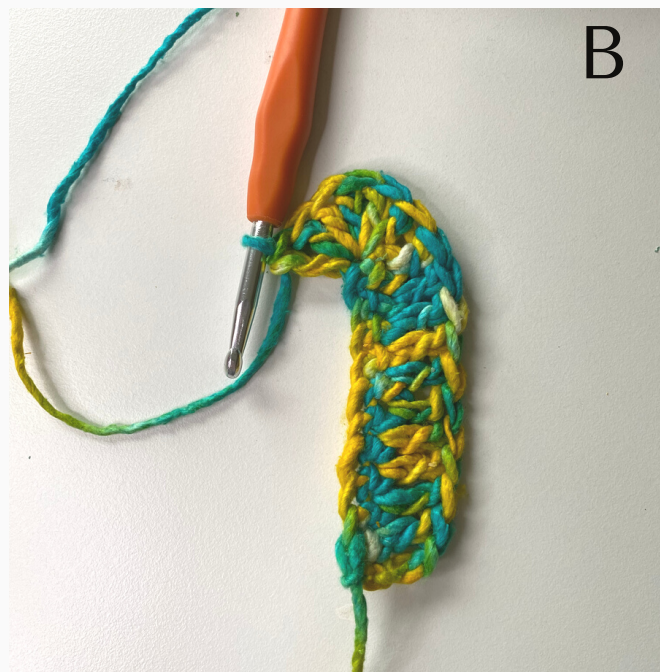
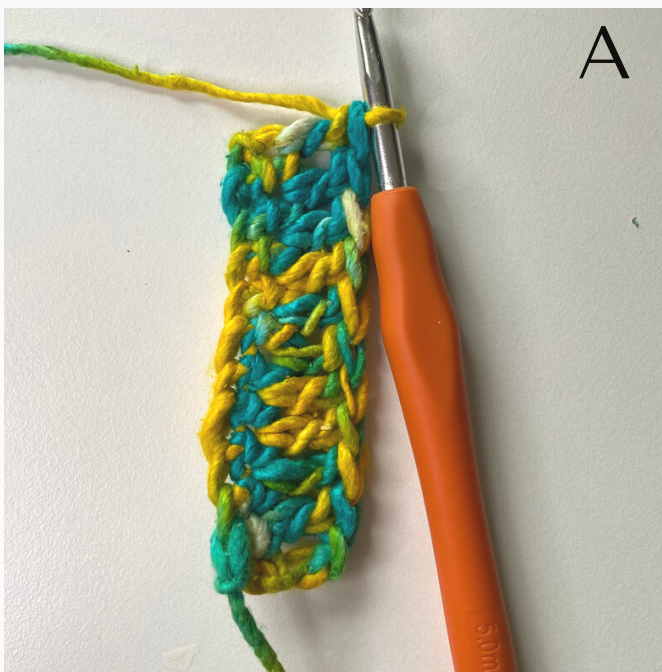


## The Cups

Make two

Row 1: CH 12, SC into 2nd loop from hook, 10 more SC (11 SC)

Row 2: CH2 turn, (A) DC into every stitch (11 DC), (B) 6 DC into side of last SC, this will rotate your work 180 degrees to the right, work along the backside of the original foundation, (C) place 1 DC into each stitch (10 DC)



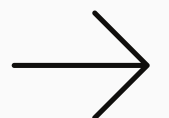
## The Cups

Row 3: CH 2 turn, Back Post Double Crochet (BPDC) in next 12 stitches, 5 DC in next stitch, BPDC in next 12 stitches, DC in top of CH 2 from previous row

Row 4: CH 2, turn, BPDC in next 14 stitches, 5 DC in next stitch, BPDC in next 14 stitches, DC in CH 2 from previous row

Row 5: CH 2, turn, BPDC in next 16 stitches, 5 DC in next stitch, BPDC in next 16 stitches, DC in CH 2 from previous row

Row 6: CH 2, turn, BPDC in next 18 stitches, 5 DC in next stitch, BPDC in next 18 stitches, DC in CH 2 from previous row



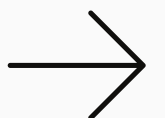


## The Cups

Row 7: CH 2, turn, BPDC in next 20 stitches, 5 DC in next stitch, BPDC in next 20 stitches, DC in CH 2 from previous row

End of cup

Modification: to make a larger cup, continue rows in same pattern: CH 2, turn, BPDC in next  $N+2$  stitches, 5 DC in next stitch, BPDC in next  $N+2$  stitches, DC in CH 2 from previous row (where  $N$  is the number of stitches from the previous row)

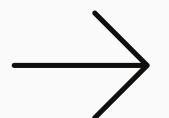


## Joining the Cups

1. Working with second cup, chain 5 (makes a loop), rotate work 90 degrees, place 2 SC in the side of each DC along bottom
2. Pick up first cup, continue to place 2 SC in the side of each DC
3. When you reach the end, drop the elastic
4. Make a loop: Chain 5, SC in same place
5. SL-ST along the side of the cup until you reach the 5 DC's at the top, in the middle DC, ST-ST, CH 5 and SL-ST
6. Continue to SL-ST until you reach the place where the two cups join, place 1 SC around that place and continue to SL-ST to the top of the next cup, make a loop like before and finish the SL-ST border



7. Cut yarn, weave in ends (including elastic)



## The Straps

The bust tie: Chain a length of yarn long enough to reach around your under-bust twice with extra to tie a bow, cut yarn and secure end

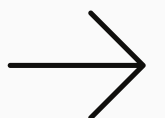
The neck tie: Chain a length of yarn long enough to wrap from the top of the cups around your neck twice with extra to tie a bow, cut yarn and secure end

For both ties, thread the chain into the loops and tie together (see cover photo for reference)

Final note: the yarn used in this tutorial is not intended to be worn in water, other materials may be used if the desired top is to be worn in the pool or ocean. Consider using a cotton spandex blend yarn for this purpose
