

THE MOON GRANNY SQUARE

Intro

This pattern is for the moon granny square. This granny square uses two colors and a variation of stitches of differing heights to create a crescent moon motif.

Use this granny square in your hats, bags, pot holders and scarfs! The possibilities are endless. You could even use these as pockets for your sweaters or make an entire sweater with the moon!

Yarns & Tools

- Yarn: Worsted Weight (weight 4)
 - color 1 (blue/purple) ~ 22 yards
 - color 2 (yellow/white) ~ 3 yards
- Crochet Hook - 4.5 mm
- Tapestry Needle
- Stitch Markers (2)



Measurements

Final square measures 5 by 5 inches

Terms

- CH - Chain
- SL ST - Slip Stitch
- SC - Single Crochet
- HDC - Half Double Crochet
- DC - Double Crochet
- eDC - Extended Double Crochet
- TR - Triple Crochet

Special Stitches

eDC - Extended Double Crochet: yarn over, inset hook into stitch and pull up a loop, there are three loops on your hook, yarn over pull through one loop, yarn over pull through 2 loops, yarn over pull through 2 loops

Information

This granny square is worked in rounds. The starting chains of each round do count as stitches. Round two uses both color 1 and color 2 and is worked on both the right side and the wrong side, pay attention to the pattern instructions especially close for this round

Stitches in parenthesis are meant to be placed into the same stitch. (2 HDC) means place two half double crochets into the next stitch

The Pattern

Foundation: using Color 1, CH 4, SL ST to 1st ST to form a ring

Round 1: CH 4, 19 eDC into ring, SL ST to 4th chain of starting CH 4 to join
(20 stitches in total)

Round 2a: Corner 1: CH 3, turn, (TR, CH 3, DC, DC) into same stitch as CH 3

- Side 1: DC, (2 HDC), (2 HDC), DC
- Corner 2: (2 DC, CH 2, 2 TR) in next stitch. Place a stitch marker into the working yarn color 1 and pause here

Round 2b: turn work so the right side of round 2 is facing you, in the 1st stitch to the left of the starting CH 3 from round 2a, attach color 2

- Moon: Chain 1, SC in next stitch, HDC, (2 DC), (2 DC), eDC, (2 eDC), (2 eDC), eDC, (2 DC), (2 DC), HDC, SC, SL-ST, CH 1 and insert stitch marker to hold yarn color 2 from unraveling (14 stitches including CH 1 and SL-ST)

Round 2c: Side 2: turn work and return to color 1, remove stitch marker and insert hook, in next stitch place eDC, DC, HDC, HDC, HDC, HDC

- Corner 3: (2 DC, CH 3, 2 DC) in next stitch
- Side 3: DC, HDC, HDC, HDC, HDC, DC
- Corner 4: (2 DC, CH 3, 2 DC) in next stitch
- Side 4: HDC, HDC, HDC, HDC, DC, eDC, SL ST to 3rd chain of starting CH 3 from round 2a

(10 stitches each side)

The Pattern Cont.

Round 3: CH 2, turn work, DC in each stitch along the side and in every chain 3 corner space place (2 DC, CH 3, 2DC)

(14 stitches each side)

At the end of Round 3, the square measures 5 inches by 5 inches

Round 4 - n: repeat Round 3

Stitch count increases by 4 stitches on each side for every round added

Remember to turn your work every round to achieve a proper square
